Moved by F.Johnston, seconded by W.Macdonald that "The usual prizes of chickens should prevail again for 1957" was duly carried and G.Philip agreed to arrange delivery of suitable birds @ 45 cents a pound.

Cards and Prizes G.Bull Refreshments C.Collett Rifles and Ammunition E.Stock completed the convening committee.

After a suitable tribute of silence was offered to the memory of those recently lost, the four guests of the 1956 Shoot, were welcomed to full membership in the Club. and E.Marsh, S.Phillips, C.Bickford, G.Moore were duly entered in the Roster. A special prize of a set of bathroom scales, was donated by F.Johnston and gratefully accepted.

A lively discussion re the procedure of inviting guests resulted in a move by L.Smith and seconded by W.Durrance "That after a brief introduction by his sponsor, invitations to candidates should be issued in the order of the greatest number of votes received by the nominee". This motion was carried and the same two members acting as scrutineers brought in the following tabulation.

All existing committees agreed to serve.






