Canada Honours Queen's Own Veteran...

The Regiment is delighted to learn of the admission of LCOL The HON. Barnett J. Danson to the Order of Canada in the grade of Officer.

Barney Danson was born and educated in Toronto and at the age of 18 enlisted as a Rifleman in the Queen's Own. He was commissioned from the ranks and was wounded in Normandy while serving as a platoon commander. He later served as the Honorary Lieutenant Colonel of the Regiment and continues to be an active member of the Regimental Senate.

In 1968 he was elected to Parliament as Liberal MP for York North. He was re-elected in 1972 and 1974, serving until 1979. He was Parliamentary Secretary to Prime Minister Trudeau who made him Minister of State for Urban Affairs with additional responsibilities for housing and the National Capital Commission.

In this portfolio he served as Chairman of the U.N. Conference on Human Settlements.

In 1976 he became Minister of National Defence serving in that portfolio until 1979. It is generally felt by the military that he was one of the most effective and popular Ministers of Defence in decades.

Barney Danson takes

particular pride as the founder of Katimivik, the national youth program considered by many to be the most successful of its kind ever undertaken in Canada.

Since leaving politics, Barney has served on numerous Boards and organizations giving freely of his time to the benefit of mankind.

He is currently active as Chairman of The No Price Too High Foundation which is dedicated to supporting the production of T.V. films and publications relating to Canadian history.

LCOL Danson is married to Isobel Bull, an inspiring concert pianist, whom he met and married in London, England. They have four sons and eight grandchildren.

THE QUEEN'S OWN RIFLES OF CANADA

Commanding Officer's Report

As I write, the Queen's Own Rifles are preparing to attend the Area Concentration at CFB Petawawa from August 10th to August 22nd. Joining the battalion will be three sections of British regular troops from our allied regiments. The 4th Battalion, Royal Green Jackets; the 10th Battalion of The Parachute Regiment; and the 5th Battalion of the Princess of Wales's Royal Regiment are each sending a section each of which will be integrated with a different platoon of The Queen's Own Rifles.

Our company, under the command of CAPT John Fotheringham, will be one of the four dismounted light infantry companies under my command as the Commanding Officer of the 1st Toronto Light Infantry Battalion during Exercise Trillium Phoenix. A squadron of Cougars, a reconnaissance platoon and a mortar platoon have also been allocated to the battalion. Other composite battalions are being sent from the Ottawa and London areas. A composite armoured regiment is also being thrown into the fray. A live

enemy for the final exercise is being provided by troops from the Regular Force.

The defensive phase of war is the Concentration's objective this summer and training before the final training exercise will consist of "stands" organized by Regular Force units stationed at CFB Petawawa.

The Queen's Own Rifles have been allocated 66 parachute positions in the re-organized airborne component of the Regular Force. It would appear that we are the only Reserve Force unit with parachute positions having been allocated about 10% of the parachute positions in the Canadian Forces.

Finally I am pleased to report that Toronto District has embarked on a plan to recruit and train a significant number of new soldiers in the coming year. This will require the allocation of quite a number of NCOs to the District Battle School. Although a worthwhile project, this will limit our ability to conduct collective training within the unit.

Deputy Commanding Officer's Report

A nation-wide review of Militia armouries is underway with a view to reducing overhead costs. Moss Park Armoury is high on the "hit" list. A move would be welcome if the new location and facilities were suitable.

With the reduction of CFB Toronto to nominal status, the unit acquired many financial responsibilities. We have been allocated a budget of \$485,000 for the current fiscal year to cover travel, allowances, reserve pay, full-time

complement to our Regular Force cadre, meals, buses, office supplies, NPF grants, etc. Thus, the amount left for reserve pay will be a great deal less than in the previous year unless Toronto District is able to come up with additional funds.

We were ranked near the top of units in Toronto District in our administrative and equipment inspections this year which is due, to a large extent, to our full-time staff (Regular and Reserve) and a few dedicated volunteers.

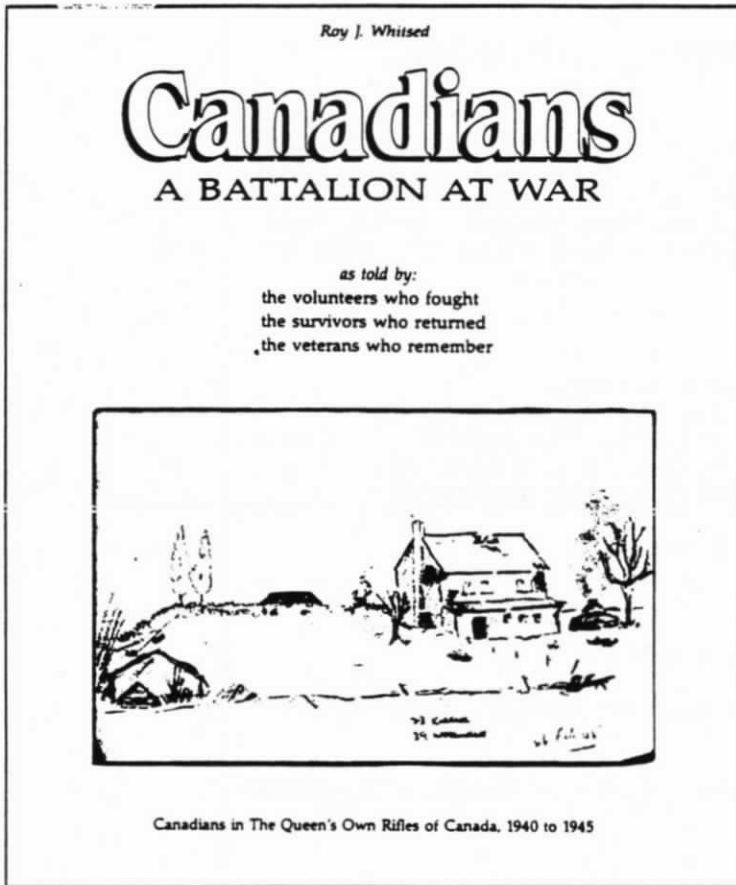
