### Canada's Foremost Peacekeeper Retires

MGEN Lew MacKenzie, whose resolute and courageous performance in Sarajevo captured the hearts of all Canadians, bid farewell to the Canadian Armed Forces on March 5th when he gave up command of Land Force Central Area to MGEN Brian Vernon.

In the months prior to retirement, MGEN MacKenzie addressed thousands of Canadians on his peacekeeping experiences and participated in numerous public functions which included the opening of the 20th annual Canadian International Autoshow in Toronto.

Contrary to press reports, MGEN MacKenzie has denied that he will seek political office. He has been hired by Baton Broadcasting as a TV commentator on international affairs, duties he will undoubtedly assume on completion of a book he is writing on his military experiences, particularly as they relate to peacekeeping operations around the world.

Earlier in the year, MGEN MacKenzie was awarded a second Meritorious Service Cross (MSC) for his outstanding service in Sarajevo. His first

MSC was awarded for his superb command of the United Nations observer group that helped implement the Nicaragua peace accord in 1990.

All members of the Regimental Family congratulate MGEN MacKenzie on his remarkable achievements during his 34 years of devoted service and wish him, his wife Dora and their daughter Kim all the best in their future endeavours.

### Former Minister of National Defence Honoured

LCOL The Honourable B.J. Danson, a Queen's Own veteran of WW2, former Honorary Lieutenant Colonel of the Regiment, and a former Minister of National Defence, will be awarded an Honorary Doctorate by the Royal Military College during the College's graduating ceremonies in Kingston on May 14th. June 10.. A visit to the **Caen Museum for Peace**, where, I'm told, they've added quite a lot of Canadian participation that was not in the Museum when we visited in 1989.

June 11.. Visit to **Falaise** area and general sightseeing.

June 12.. Leave the area this morning, travelling north and pay

our respects at Canada's **Vimy Memorial**. Then, swinging south through **Picardy** and the **Valley of the Somme** to **Paris**. This evening, enjoy a "Farewell to France" dinner and cabaret show.

June 13.. Transfer to the airport in time for return flight home. Meals will be served aboard the aircraft. Arrive home same day.

# 1992 Trust Fund Report

LCOL J.G.B. Strathy, President of The Queen's Own Rifles of Canada Trust Fund, and his Trustees wish to express their gratitude to those members of the Regimental Family and to those friends of the Regiment who were so generous in their financial support of the Trust Fund.

A total of \$12,471 was donated to the Trust Fund by 173 individual contributors. The average contribution was \$72.09, a commendable figure indeed.

A breakdown of donations is

shown in the chart below.

As commendable as this support may be, it is regretted that out of a mailing list of 1,023 only 173 persons felt an obligation to support their Regiment.

It is the hope of the Trustees that the number of supporters increases significantly in 1993 to allow the Trust Fund to meet its financial obligations to the various components of the Regiment.
