Two cork plugs joined by a tope are provided with each respirator in order to prevent entry of water to the container when there is risk of respirator being immersed. When the respirator is carried the plugs will be in position on the container. When not in use, the plugs will be carried in the haversack, and secured by passing the tape joining them under the flap of the pocket provided for the ant-dim, or under the loop provided to house the haversack sling. 5. The haversack must NOT be scrubbed with soap and water or treated with khaki equipment cleaner as both have a deterious effect on the special finish of the cloth. Mud on the haversack will be removed with a dry cloth or brush. Discs identity will be secured with a length of cord about the container mount on the face piece.
