I thank you for the service you have given to CANADA and to the great CAUSE for which we took to arms and for the gallantry on the field of battle wherever it has come.

You, in the Army, here in the United Kingdom, in Italy and elsewhere, and you, who stand ready and in support, -- you are now well trained, well organized, well equipped; your leaders, in all grades are proved; your staffs are skilled and devoted to the service of the troops. I have confidence you will succeed in all you undertake.

I pray there will come an early and triumphant end to this present strife and that soon you may return once more to Canada, your land and home. May Divine Providence bless you one and all.

9. DRESS

In accordance with Bn Standing Orders, brown shoes or boots will NOT be worn on duty or off. This applies to ALL ranks. Offences against this order will be dealt with by disciplinary action.

10. C.A.C.R.O. 4083 - UNAUTHORIZED CARRIAGE OF DOCUMENTS AND CORRESPONDENCE.

a. Cases have occurred in which offrs and other ranks travelling to and from the United Kingdom have carried military documents and private correspondence in contravention of existing regulations.

b. Owing to the fact that forced landings, accidents, or loss by enemy action of sea or air transports cannot be avoided, rigid compliance with regulations is essential. Military documents and private correspondence are safeguarded during official transmission, and adequate precautions are taken to assure that they do NOT fall into the hands of the enemy. But the indiscriminate carrying of documents and correspondence by individuals endangers Security.

c. Attention of all offrs and other ranks is drawn to Overseas RO 1089, para 6, which reads as follows:-
"It is forbidden to make use of the Civil Postal Service outside of the United Kingdom, or therein, when the Army Postal Service is available, or to transmit correspondence by the hand of an offr, soldier or civilian, proceeding outside the United Kingdom or a theatre of operation, except by a recognized military messenger service."

d. Disciplinary action will be taken if further breaches of these regulations are reported.


